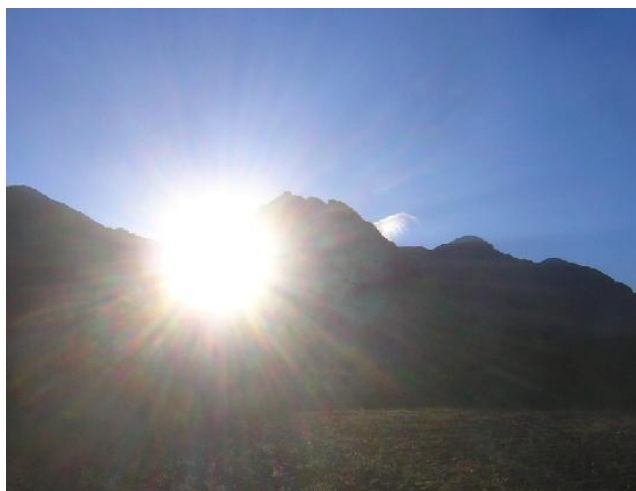


Base Location: Hatun Wasi Center, Urubamba in the Sacred Valley of the Incas, 1 hr from Cuzco.

- Arrive in Lima on April 30th or before, to start program and meet our Peru hosts in Lima Airport on morning of May 1, 2011
- Book your airline departure in the afternoon on or after, May 18, 2.
- This schedule is a basic outline only. Our schedule is subject to change at any time due to the guidance of the Grandmothers and Grandfathers given to White Eagle and the medicine work of Grandmother Drum. (this is, after all, a Mystery School!)

Day 1, Sunday May 1st:

Lima/Cuzco flight, Sacred Valley, Hatun Wasi Center. Andean lunch. Dinner and overnight in HW.

Meet in Lima airport for the Lima/Cuzco flight. Reception at the Cuzco airport and transfer to Hatun Wasi Center, located in the Sacred Valley of the Incas, Urubamba town, that will be our base-lodging. Located approximately at 500 mts. below the altitude of Cuzco city, it will be more favorable to stabilize our bodies, with the new altitude and to move to our destinies within the Sacred Valley.

Day for integration of the group. Rest and enjoy a natural Andean meal in Hatun Wasi's ample gardens to recharge ourselves with the Energy of the new Magnetic Center of the Planet. Home made dinner and good night sleep in HW.



Day 2, Monday, May 2nd: Moray and Salineras. GMDRUM Ceremony in Moray. Dinner and overnight in HW.



After breakfast, we depart to visit the Archaeological Complex of Moray where we will enjoy a GRANDMOTHER DRUM Ceremony. Box lunch. Later on, visit to the Salineras of Maras, the Salt mines of the Incas, where a springwater sprout feeds around 4,000 flats for evaporation.

Spectacular scenery walk to the Sacred Valley. Transfer to Hatun Wasi. Home made dinner and good night sleep in HW.



Day 3, Tuesday, May 3rd:

Pisac: ruins and andean market. Lunch. Visit to Seminario's Ceramic Workshop. Dinner and overnight in HW.



After breakfast, we depart to Pisac, the Condor city, where the Sacred Valley starts, to visit the archaeological site, and connect with the Sacred Spirit of the Condor. Wonderful walk from the top of the mountain to town; then we'll enjoy a healthy lunch in town and we will have time to visit its famous Andean crafts market: the best place to appreciate and buy local handicrafts.

Then, afternoon visit to the Seminario's Workshop, where we can find the finest and most beautiful utilitarian and decorative clay pieces in Cuzco. Dinner and overnight

Day 4, Wednesday, May 4:

Optional day for an inner magical experience with the Master Plant Wachuma. Ceremony with Fred Clarke and Luz María, Sacred Sound Healers natives from Perú. Dinner and overnight in HW.*

Day 5, Thursday, May 5:

Journey to Sacred Salkantay. GMDRUM Ceremony. Box lunch, Dinner and overnight in HW.

Approx 04 hour road trip to the Apu Salkantay, the most important Glaciar and Sacred Mountain in Cuzco, for a Ceremony with GMDRUM. Box Lunch. Return back to HW. Dinner and overnight in HW.



Day 6, Friday, May 6:

Ruins surrounding Cuzco city and City tour. Dinner and overnight in HW.



Breakfast and visit to the ruins surrounding Cuzco City: Tambomachay (temple for the Waters), Qenqo (Labyrinth for Ceremonies), Sacsayhuaman (Fortress-Temple, the head of the Puma). Box lunch in nature.

Afternoon visit to San Blas, the Bohemians and artisans space, starting with a walking tour through the Historical Center, the 12 angles Stone from the Archiepiscopal Palace. Optional visit to the Koricancha Temple: political and economical center in the ancient

Cuzco. Free time to visit museums, shopping or others. At 7 pm, meet in the Main Plaza to return to Hatun Wasi. Dinner and overnight in HW.

Day 7, Saturday, May 7:

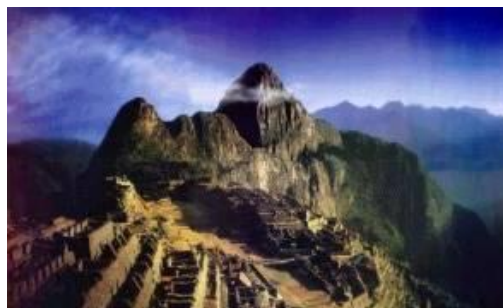
Train to Aguas Calientes. White Eagle Workshop in the Mandor cascade, in the jungle. Dinner and Overnight in Aguas Calientes.

Transfer to the Ollantaytambo train station for an 01:40 hour ride to Aguas Calientes town. Check in at hotel and 01:20 hour walk to the cascade, located in a beautiful jungle scenery, for a ritual to heal the waters of the Planet. WE workshop or Ritual in the Jungle. Box lunch. Evening walk back to Aguas Calientes; optional relaxing bath in the Incas hot springs. Dinner and overnight in Aguas Calientes.

Day 8, Sunday, May 8:

Visit to the WONDERFUL MACHU PICCHU. Box Lunch not included. Free afternoon. Train back, transfer to HW. Dinner and overnight in HW.

Early breakfast and visit to the Sacred Citadel of Machu Picchu. Ritual to connect with the Feminine Energy of Pachamama, Mother Earth in quechua language. Guided tour. Optional previous climb to Wayna Picchu and/or the Temple of the Moon. Free time to walk the archaeological site or to go back to



town. Meet in the train station to take our train back to Ollantaytambo. Transfer to HW.
Dinner and overnight in HW.

Day 9, Monday, May 9:

OPTIONAL AYA WASCA CEREMONY*

Internalization and preparation day for the night Ceremony with the Master Plant Ayahuasca, to be held with an experienced native Shaman from the southern Perú jungle. Free day for the ones that wont experience the Ceremony. Dinner* and overnight in HW.

Day 10, Tuesday, May 10:



Ollantaytambo. Lunch not included. Temple of the Condor. GMDRUM Ceremony. Dinner and overnight in HW.

Early breakfast, time to integrate and share with the Shaman. Visit to Ollantaytambo, the unique living Inca town. Visit to the archaeological site and the Temple of the Condor

Initiational Altar and Doorway. Box Lunch. Afternoon visit to the town itself and a local house, the Corn City. Transfer, dinner and overnight in HW.

Day 11, Wednesday, May 11:

Cuzco-Puno road trip. Dinner and sleep in Puno.

Breakfast and road trip to Puno city, around 8 hours total. Box Lunch on the way. Stop in La Raya, limit between Cuzco and Puno, over 4,380 mts high osl. Arrival to Puno, check in at hotel. Novo andean dinner in a typical restaurant and overnight in Puno.



Día 12, Thursday, May 12:

Visit to the Uros floating islands and GMDRUM Ceremony at the shore of Sacred Titicaca. Dinner not included and overnight in Puno.



Early breakfast and depart to visit the Uros floating islands in Titicaca, the highest navigable Lake all over the world. Boat journey back to Puno port. Box lunch. Afternoon GMDRUM Ceremony at the shore of the Sacred Titicaca with Crystal Bowls and Andean Sacred Instruments. Transfer back to our Puno hotel. Free time, dinner not included and overnight in Puno.

Day 13, Friday, May 13:

Phallic Temple in Chucuito and the Aramu Muru Doorway. GMDRUM Ceremony. Dinner not included and overnight in Puno.

Breakfast and visit to the Phallic Temple, for fertility of seeds. Box lunch. Sound Healing Ceremony with WE, Fred and Luz María at the Merú God and Goddess Doorway, the ones who incarnated in Manco Capac and Mama Ocllo, founders of the Inca Empire. Evening transfer back to hotel in Puno. Free time, dinner not included and overnight in Puno.

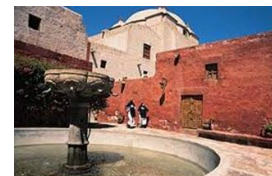


Day 14, Saturday, May 14:

Puno/Arequipa by road. City tour. Dinner and sleep in Arequipa.



Early breakfast and road trip to Arequipa, the White City, around 6 hours total. Arrival at our hotel. Lunch. City tour and optional visit to Santa Catalina Monastery. Dinner and overnight in Arequipa.



Day 15, Sunday, May 15:

Arequipa - Nazca by road. Dinner and overnight in Nazca.

Early breakfast and departure to the city of Nazca, approx **8 hours total**. Box lunch. Arrival to hotel in Nazca, free time to enjoy the pool, rest or others. Dinner and overnight in Nazca.

Day 16, Monday, May 16:

Optional overflight the Nazca lines. Lunch. Afternoon Ceremony with GMDRUM in Cahuachi. Dinner and overnight in Nazca.

Optional flight over the Nazca lines, one of the most enigmatic places on earth. Lunch and afternoon Ceremony with GMDRUM in Cahuachi Ceremonial Center in the southern coast of Perú, where the seers lived. Dinner and sleep in Nazca.



Day 17, Tuesday, May 17:

Nazca / Paracas, optional Ballestas Islands tour. Seafood Lunch.

FULL MOON CLOSING CEREMONY IN THE SOUTHERN HEMISPHERE, IN THE PARACAS NATURAL RESEARCH, WITH WHITE EAGLE AND GMDRUM, FRED AND LUZ MARIA.

Dinner and overnight in Ica.



Early breakfast and road trip to the Paracas National Research (4 hours total), that has the richest in species sea on the planet. Optional visit to the Ballestas Islands. Afterwards we



will enjoy a delicious sea food, typical of the Peruvian coast.

Night Closing GMDRUM Ceremony in the Magical and Stillness Beauty of the Natural Research, in the Pacific Sea Southern coast.

Dinner and sleep in Ica.

Day 18, Wednesday, May 18:

Depart to Lima. Lunch. Day use in a hotel in Miraflores. Transfer to Lima airport.

Breakfast and continue our journey to Lima (5 hours total), where we will have a day use stay in a Miraflores hotel, and or at the right time, transfer to the Jorge Chavez International Airport to take our international flight back home.

THE TOUR PACKAGE INCLUDES:

All expressly specified services in the itinerary: Lima/Cuzco flight (considered at a cost of US\$150 right now. If this cost changes at the momento of buying it, the difference will be assumed by the traveler); every transportation and boat in private for the group, lodgings on the basis of double occupation room, breakfasts, specified box lunches during the transfers and specified dinners. Train tickets to Machu Picchu in vistadome service or similar, 01 entrance to the Sacred Citadel and its corresponding bus tickets up and down. Touristic tickets to every specified Archaeological sites and every visit specified throughout all the trip. On free days, meals will not be included. Free wifi Internet in own traveler's laptop in Hatun Wasi and in Puno hotel. Official guides where required. In Lima, Machu Picchu and Puno hotels are 3 star category; Hatun Wasi in the Sacred Valley, is a countryside lodge.

DOES NOT INCLUDE:

- * International flights, nor airport national or international flight taxes, at a cost of: Lim/Cuz Flight tax: 20 soles, Jul/Lim Flight tax: 14 soles and Lima/Alaska of US\$32, will be around US\$45 total for the 3 of them, at this moment, but can slightly change any time for it is a national regulation.
- * Personal expenses as national or international calls, Internet, laundry, luggage excess, alcoholic beverages, medicines, gratuities, medical insurance for the trip and/or any other not specified service in this package.
- * Cuzco Cathedral entrance fee at a cost of S/25 (around 9US now).
- * Hotsprings bath in Aguas Calientes: S/10
- * Not included dinners around US\$12 each
- * Visit to Santa Catalina Monastery in Arequipa, around \$15
- * Optional Overflight to Nazca lines, approx US\$70

OPTIONAL CEREMONIES, PER PERSON:

- * Wachuma - San Pedro at a cost of US\$80.
- * Ayawasca, at a cost of US\$90 per one session, in a minimum of 10 persons.

OTHER ADDITIONALS/OPTIONALS:

- * Individual Coca Leaves Reading by an exceptional Andean seers to a cost of US\$35, not included in the cost of the package and to be paid directly to her.
- * Andean therapeutic massages, at a cost of \$35 per one hour session, to be paid to the professional.

REFUND POLICY: IMPORTANT NOTE: Due to the expenses in freighting Grandmother Drum, tour prices based on certain group rates and the nature of this program, registration is non-refundable and non-transferable. Please purchase trip insurance if needed.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

- * Bring to the travel your medical insurance info updated, and buy a medical travel insurance when purchasing your international flights.
- * Bring your specialized medication if needed. For simple cases, there are pharmacies everywhere.
- * In Cuzco and Puno it is easy to buy very warm wool or alpaca sweaters, scarves, gloves, socks and others.
- * There are lots of souvenirs. Peruvian cotton is very good quality. Respecting ceramics, can take a look to spouses Pablo and Marilu Seminario, website, whose workshop we will visit: <http://www.ceramicaseminario.com>, but there are different qualities and prices, of course.
- * There are many mystical objects in Pisac, Ollantaytambo and Aguas Calientes: crystals, decoratives, dream catchers, stones, etc for all tastes, such as blankets, carpets and jewelry that can send even the most delightful tastes during your stay, many Andean music CDs pretty easy to get etc.
- * Laundry can be washed in HW or elsewhere, at an additional cost, coordinating with enough time in advance.

WEATHER:

Be aware that we will be in many diverse altitudes, geographic areas and therefore, climates:

- ** **ANDES/SIERRA:** high, dry, cold nights and warm during daytime: Cuzco (3,300 msnm/10,826 feet osl, ranging between 28° and 5°C), Sacred Valley (2,800 m/ 9,186 feet osl, ranging between 29° and 12°C), Puno (3,810 feet msnm/12,500, between 22° and 0° C) and Arequipa (2,360 feet msnm/7,742 osl, between 21° and 10°C) weather could be too diverse even in the same day. Always at daytime it is very sunny, very hot. But if it is cloudy, the temperature drops down very quickly.
- * When arriving to Cuzco around 11:00 am, the weather is very warm, about 25 degrees or so. As the weather around the world has changed so dramatically, it could still be some occasional rain.
- * In the Sacred Valley, we are at 500 meters below Cuzco, making it warmer at day and nighttime.
- * In Puno (Lake Titicaca), weather can get very cold in the early morning and evening.
- ** **JUNGLE:** hot and humid and very changeable: Machu Picchu (2,438 m / 7,998 feet osl, ranging between 24° and 12°C).

- ** **COAST:** wet, cold and sometimes fresh: Ica (Nazca -520 meters/1,706 feet osl, and Paracas -0 m/0 feet osl, 23° to 30° C), Lima (0 to 160 m/0 to 524 feet osl, 23° to 30° C)

WHAT TO BRING & BAGGAGE TIPS:

A very valuable suggestion is to bring a good warm jacket or similar, cotton clothing to wear in layers to suit weather changes comfortably. The extra clothing will always remain in our bus safely, which is always very close to us, while we are doing the visits.

- * Winter and summer pajamas, earplugs and sleep mask (for those who need them).
- * A warm jacket or lightweight anorak.
- * A warm vest or waistcoat.
- * A lightweight waterproof and windproof jacket, for precaution (can buy them here)
- * Wool hat, socks, gloves and scarves (or buy them here also).
- * Sunscreen, insect repellent, lip balm.
- * Sunglasses and a cap.
- * 2 pairs comfortable shoes for walking;
- * Several pairs of cotton socks.
- * Bathing suit for hot springs, pool and beach, no towels, very cheap to rent here.

- * Loose, comfortable cotton and windproof material trousers.
- * Cotton shirts and 2 sweatshirts;
- * Medium sized backpack for daily journeys and for the 2 day visit to Machu Picchu, for heavy bags are not allowed on trains.
- * Camera, phone or alarm clock. Wet wipes. Padlock with key.
- * Chocolates, nuts, candies, energy bars of your choice, but can also be purchased here.
- * A notebook and pen for notes.

This is a reference list, avoid excess weight in baggage so won't pay for it. However, many travelers leave their old clothes (to donate to poor people) to make more space in their luggage when they return back to their countries.
